

JOB MARKET ACTIVITY

MONTHLY JOB POSTINGS



Vacancies (seasonally adjusted)

From January 2022 to January 2024 there was a **-4%** decrease in recruitment activity.

Year-on-year, hiring activity decreased by **-8%**, compared to January 2023.

January 2024 showed low hiring activity for this time of the year. This is partly attributed to the long school holiday period. School holidays have a significant impact on economic activity and productivity since a substantial part of the country's workforce takes leave during school holidays. In 2022, the first day of school was 12 January; in 2023 the first day of school was 11 January; this year the first day of school was 17 January. As a result, January 2024 was left with significantly less working days (after the school holidays) compared to the years before. This factor had an immediate impact on hiring and economic activity.

TRENDING JOB SECTORS



Cleaning, Maintenance & Repair


- Year-on-year, there was a +20% increase in hiring activity.
- This sector has seen stable hiring activity over the past 13 months.
- In Q4:2023 this sector experienced elevated hiring activity.





Building & Construction


- Year-on-year, there was a +23% increase in hiring activity.
- Although hiring activity has decreased over the last 2 months, this sector experienced growing recruitment activity throughout most of 2023.





Architecture & Engineering

- Year-on-year, there was a +17% increase in hiring activity.
- This sector experienced a dip in hiring activity over the last 2 months, however hiring activity remained steady in 2023.






SNAPSHOT OF THE MEDICAL & HEALTH SECTOR



AVERAGE STAY BY CANDIDATES IN THEIR JOBS






THE RISE OF AI IN THE JOB MARKET

Where in South Africa are Al candidates needed?






WHAT ARE TYPICAL AI JOB ROLES?

Analysing the job market over the last 12 months, the majority of AI job roles are IT- related. The top 3 in-demand AI roles are:

- Data Scientist
- **■** Data Engineer
- Data Analyst

However, other job roles where AI skills are demanded are Software developers (11%), Machine learning Specialists (9%), Business Analysts (4%), Sales professionals (4%) and IT Architects (3%).





In Gauteng, across all sectors, the most significant growth in hiring activity was evident in Building & Construction over the last 12 months. Although recruitment activity dipped slightly towards the end of 2023, year-on-year hiring activity for Building & Construction staff is up by 35% in Gautena.


In Limpopo, demand for Business & Management staff saw continual growth for most of 2023. As a result, staff is this sector has increased by **97%** year-on-year.

Hiring activity for Finance professionals has been growing consistently since September 2023 in Limpopo. Year-on-year, demand for Finance professionals has grown by 97% in this province
